6. FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 FIRST QUARTER BUDGET REPORT

Michael Solorza, Director of Finance, presented the Staff Report to City Council. Director Solorza also presented a PowerPoint presentation where he provided the City Council with

an overview on adopted vs. projected, revenue highlights, expenditure updates, hotel operations update, Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, and staffing.

Mayor Pro Tem Jimenez motioned, seconded by Councilmember Melendez that the City Council:

- 1) Receive and file this agenda report and the presentation on the Fiscal Year 2021-22 First Quarter Budget report; and
- 2) Approve the updated and amended new Resolution Adopting the Compensation Plan and Table of Organization (Attachment A) and the updated Master Position Control (Attachment B); and
- 3) Take whatever additional actions necessary.

City Manager Bobadilla and City Attorney Alvarez-Glasman explained public comment procedures.

8. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE OF A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) FOR CITY-WIDE GRAPHICS REFRESH AND REBRANDING AND PUBLIC SIGNAGE IMPROVEMENTS

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1) Authorize staff to release a Request for Proposals (RFP) to solicit qualified graphic design consultants to assist Montebello in refreshing and updating its entire graphics and branding footprint.

In its current form, SB 12 imposes a series of new and burdensome regulations on businesses, threatens thousands of housing-related jobs, and would increase the already high cost of living in Southern California.

SB 12 creates more state oversight and regulations on new housing construction, jeopardizing Governor Newsom's 1.3 million homes for the Southern California region. At a time when the state is facing a housing crisis of historic proportions, SB 12 would only worsen the situation.

The homebuilding industry has presented reasonable amendments to SB 12, which need to be incorporated into the bill. As such, I would respectfully request that your local government ask Governor Newsom and your respective state legislative delegation members to oppose SB 12 unless these necessary amendments are included in the bill.

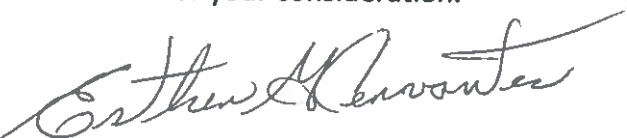

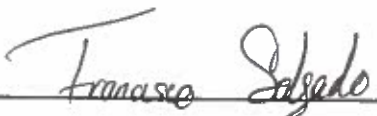

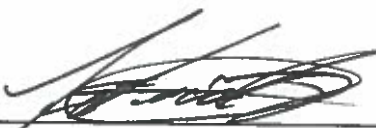
